PREPARING FOR YOUR OB ULTRASOUND

1ST Trimester OB exams (less than 13 weeks along):

You will need an empty bladder. This exam may be done two ways, transabdominal (a transducer is placed on the abdomen) or transvaginal (a long, thin transducer is inserted vaginally).

2nd and 3rd Trimester OB exams:

You will need a moderately full bladder. Drink at least 16 ounces of water at least 30 minutes prior to your appointment time. DO NOT EMPTY YOUR BLADDER. This exam will be transabdominal only.

FAQ'S

A. What can I expect from my obstetrical (OB) ultrasound?

Our first concern is the health and wellbeing of both mother and baby. Ultrasound is a non-invasive prenatal test used to ensure your baby is developing properly. Your exam will be divided into 2 parts.

Part 1 – During this portion of your exam, only the expectant mother, and one other person, will be allowed in the room. The technologist uses this time to thoroughly evaluate your baby and to acquire standard images which are then reviewed by our radiologist.

Part 2 – During this part of the exam, additional family members are welcome in the room. After reviewing all the images obtained, a brief real time scan will be performed.

B. How long will the exam take?

A 2nd – 3rd trimester OB ultrasound involves acquiring over 60 – 70 different areas of anatomy to be examined. So, each examination may take up to one hour, sometimes longer.

C. Will I find out the gender?

Gender is not part of the diagnostic evaluation. Upon personal request, and depending on your baby's position/stage of development, the sonographer may not be able to determine the gender with any degree of certainty. Please realize this is not the intent of the exam.

D. Will I get a CD/DVD?

A CD with all of the images/pictures acquired from your exam, will be given to you prior to you leaving.

E. When will I receive my results?

All ultrasound scans are interpreted by a radiologist. Routine reports will be available to the ordering provider within 24 hours.

F. Is it alright to bring my other children to my appointment?

In order to provide a safe environment for your children, and proper exam for you, another adult must accompany any minor children while you are having your ultrasound.
